## BE RESTORED-WEEK 2 Your Heart's Desire-Created for Intimacy

"But God proves his own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Romans 5:8 (CSB)

Do you know God wants a personal relationship with you? He desires to connect intimately with you as his child. You are not one of many. You are not lost in the crowd. His eye is upon you. His ear is attentive to you. His heart is for you. He longs for you to know how loved and valued you are by him, so much so that he sent his only son to reconcile you to himself.

Sadly, many of us see ourselves as irrelevant to God, as though if we suddenly disappeared, he would not take notice of our absence. In a sea of billions upon billions of faces, we feel we are but a speck of sand at the bottom of the ocean.

These limiting beliefs negatively impact our faith when we falsely assume God doesn't care about us or what we do with our lives. They leave us feeling stuck, overwhelmed, and discouraged, unable to move forward in Gods' purpose for us.

This week, we will look at the relationship God desires to have with his children. As you work through the lesson, ask the Lord to expose any hidden hurts or hang-ups that are hindering your intimacy with him. Prayerfully, ask the Lord to search the deep spaces of you heart and reveal areas in need of healing and restoration.

Read aloud Psalms 63:1-8 (CSB). As you do, fill in the blanks below.

"God, you are my God; I eagerly you. I for you;
my body for you in a land that is dry, desolate, and without
water. So I on you in the sanctuary to your
strength and your glory. My lips will you because your
faithful love is better than life. So I will you as long as I live;
at your name, I will up my hands. You me as

That's what we are here for, to allow God to draw us back to Him, back to a heart of worship.)


When you hear the word *intimacy*, what do you think of? You might think it refers solely to a sexual relationship. To clarify its meaning, let's look at its definition.

Dictionary.com defines <u>intimacy</u> as "the state of being intimate," "a close, familiar, and usually affectionate or loving personal relationship with another person or group," "an act or expression serving as a token of familiarity, affection, or the like," "sexual intercourse," "the quality of being comfortable, warm, or familiar."

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In your own words, write the meaning of the word "intimacy".			
The word "intimacy" is not found in most Bible translations. To better

Have you been in a relationship that just seems to flow easily? Communication and trust come so naturally, it seems almost effortless. You look forward to being together because this is the one person on Planet Earth who "gets you." Don't you wish all relationships were wired that way?

Then there are the ones that are painstakingly difficult to maintain. It's stressful trying to have a conversation when relationships are strained. Doing so risks leading to one misunderstanding after another. I've had both kinds of relationships in my lifetime, and I admit the older I get, I treasure the ones that come naturally.

God created us to have an unstrained, intimate relationship with Him, characterized by trust and open communication. All too often, unlike David, we limit our conversations to formal greetings and simple pleasantries. While we desire a deep and abiding relationship with our Lord, it may feel distant and hollow. Like attending an event with a room full of strangers, our prayer time might be spent looking for the nearest exit. If we don't know the Lord intimately, misunderstanding His character may lead to it staying that way.

If you want to draw closer to him, what needs to change first? If you're not sure, stop and pray, asking the Holy Spirit to reveal any obstacles you may not be aware of.

If your relationship with the Lord is close right now, great! For others, you may feel God is far off or even out of reach. For most, you will probably land somewhere in middle. You may be feeling as though you will never be as intimate with God as others because they somehow are more spiritually in-tune than you are. Do not fall for that lie from the enemy. God is not holding out on you. As we move forward in our study, you will soon be restored to greater intimacy with the Father as your heart learns to connect with him on a deeper level.



## Created for Intimacy

During creation God designed us for intimacy with Him and with each other. Being made in the image of God, humans are social beings. Let's go back to the beginning, to the Garden of Eden, so we can better understand the intimacy the Lord had planned for us, His creation.

Read Genesis 1:1-31 (CSB). Write Genesis 1:1 below.

The story of creation is awe-inspiring. The heavens, the earth, the sky, the sun, the plants, the animals, the fish...God created everything. Then, he made his ultimate creation.

"Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, according to our likeness. They will rule the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, the livestock, the whole earth, and the creatures that crawl on the earth." So God created man in his own image; he created him in the image of God; he created them male and female." Genesis 1:26-27

Here we see the same God who created the animals creating man and woman. In what ways were they unique to the rest of his created beings?

The Name of God in Creation: The Hebrew word used for God in these verses is *Elohim*. Grammatically, it is a noun that is a plural word being used in a singular form. You may recognize it in the short form *EL* like in the name *El-Shaddai*, *God Almighty*. Although we do not know its exact meaning, it denotes the idea of strength and power. Who was this "us" who was present at creation, who so beautifully formed our earth and sea and skies? Who was this *Elohim* who said, "Let us make man in our image, according to our likeness?" Let's get to know our Creator.

Read the following verses. Circle or Highlight any names, nouns, or pronouns referring to or describing God.

Isaiah 64:8 (CSB) – "Yet Lord, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hands."

Colossians 1:15-16 (CSB) - "He (Jesus) is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For everything was created by him, in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities-all things have been created through him and for him."

Job 33:4 (CSB) – "The Spirit of God has made me, and the breath of the Almighty gives me life."


According to these verses and those in Genesis, who was present at the creation?

Written into creation's story is a synergistic symphony, beautifully demonstrated in the relationship of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The Trinity, the Three-In-One, each present as the universe, the earth, and its inhabitants were brought into being.

Here, we observe the first intimate relationship in the Bible. Not one person in the Godhead is above the other. Nor do they work independently of each other, because they are One. He is One. This is the God of creation introducing Himself to us, so we know Him in his completeness. What we will soon come to realize is that God wants us to know Him more intimately than we can imagine. Let's dig deeper into why we struggle with intimacy with our Creator.

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We discussed earlier possible hinderances to growing in intimacy with the Lord. Take a look at the list below, and check any that are negatively impacting your intimacy with the Lord.
